Aruba Networks is committed to providing highly reliable and secure products to its customers. To this end **Aruba Threat Labs** actively engages in vulnerability discovery, threat analysis and penetration testing of Aruba products to identify and address potential security issues internally.

Aruba follows a comprehensive vulnerability response and resolution process in order to address vulnerabilities discovered in its products, and every effort is made to make a complete fix available as soon as possible. Aruba encourages responsible reporting of vulnerabilities discovered in its products by external parties, and Aruba follows responsible disclosure practices in informing our customers and the general public of such vulnerabilities. This process is facilitated by Aruba's Wireless Security Incident Response Team (WSIRT). WSIRT is the first point of contact for externally discovered vulnerabilities and security issues, and can be reached at wsirt@arubanetworks.com.

At Aruba's discretion, Aruba will publish advisories containing information about potential security vulnerabilities. All information contained in such advisories is provided to Aruba customers and partners in accordance with the terms of the license agreement that controls the recipient's use of the Aruba products. The advisory, or any revision thereof, may be distributed by recipient only after Aruba has had an opportunity to review and provide its written consent.

It is Aruba's policy to notify all of its customers of vulnerabilities at the same time. Disclosure is not selective under any circumstances, other than when there exists a potential impact to national security.
